President's report October

Since the last *Bulletin* where I raised this issue, the Prime Minister has announced that the Commonwealth Government will be pressing ahead to have history introduced as a separate subject in Years 9 and 10 in Australia's secondary schools from 2009. The Society welcomes this clear decision from the federal government and now looks for a positive response from the Queensland Government. The teaching of history as a separate subject is essential if we are to understand our nation's economic, political, social, cultural and religious past, and build for the future. It also enables us to understand the changes that are occurring in the wider world.

'Adopt a rare book project', the preservation of our old and rare books, has received expressions of interest from many members and friends of the Society. We welcome this attention and support in such an important project. Anyone interested who did not receive a brochure with the last *Bulletin* should contact the Society and a brochure will be sent.

Also, members and friends of the Society are encouraged to continue to make valuable donations to the Society's Welsby Library, which has grown considerably over recent times. It is gratifying to see these valuable contributions.

The Society's Council appointed Professor John Pearn to fill the vacancy on Council. Professor Pearn was previously a member of Council.

On 28 September members and friends of the Society gave hearty recognition to Bill Kitson for his contribution to the recording and promotion of history in Queensland. We all wished Bill a great retirement but noted that he would be back at his loved Museum of Lands, Mapping and Surveying on Wednesdays.

Country News

Bellthorpe - The Centenary Fair was organised for 5 September to celebrate the centenary of the proclamation of land being open for selection at Bellthorpe. Displays of photographs and other displays marked the event. A booklet, *Bellthorpe - 100 Years of People*, was compiled for the occasion. Past pupils of the Bellthorpe school which was approved in 1934 also gathered. (*The Range News* {Maleny} 13 September 2007 p.16)

Gayndah - The historical society has gained the records of the now defunct Reid's Creek Hall Committee. The society also holds records relating to Rawbelle Shire, jockey club records and *Queensland Government Gazettes*. The society has a temperature controlled store room for the records. (*Central and North Burnett Times* 13 September 2007 p.5 including photo of RHSQ and Gayndah Society members, Cynthia Bertlesen with some of the records)

Hodgkinson Goldfield - Tyrconnell Historic Goldmine - Ms Cate Harley and Mr Andrew Bell have received funding from the Environmental Protection Agency under the Living Buildings and Places funding program to re-roof one of the mine buildings. (*Tablelands Advertiser* 19 September 2007 p.7)

Irvinebank - The School of Arts and Progress Association has received a grant from the Environmental Protection Agency under the Living Buildings and Places funding program. It is for replacement of the front steps and restumping sections of *Loudoun* House (constructed by John Moffat in 1884), and providing disabled access to it. (*Tablelands Advertiser* 19 September 2007 p.7)

Maleny - Mary Cairncross Reserve has been developed by Maleny Rotary Club (formed in 1959) over many years. Members worked on clearing dead trees, draining bogs, establishing walking tracks and a picnic area, identifying and plate naming trees and mowing grass. (*Range News* {Maleny} 13 September 2007 p.13)

Nebo - The Nebo Shire Council has erected silhouettes of two Brahman bulls cut out of flat steel. The adjacent signs outline the history of the area. The first station, *Fort Cooper*, was taken up by William Landsborough in 1856. The name, Nebo, was given to the town in 1923. Cattle became the chief industry until coal mines were opened at nearby Coppabella in

1998. (*North Queensland Register* 13 September 2007 p.11 including photo)

Rockhampton The Forde Plaque, commemorating Francis (Frank) Michael Forde, Australian Labor Prime Minister from 6 to 13 July 1945, was unveiled by the Acting Mayor of Rockhampton, Cr Jim Webber, in Forde Park in August. There were speeches by Cr Webber, President of the Rockhampton and District Historical Society Mr John Fletcher, and Member for Capricornia Ms Kirsten Livermore MP. The Historical Society provided the plaque and the Council installed it. The function concluded with morning tea at the Rocky Gardens Motor Inn. Winton - The Diamantina Heritage Truck and Machinery Museum at Winton was opened during the festivities of the 32nd Outback Festival from 26 to 30 September 2007. (*North Queensland Register* 13 September 2007 p.11)

Tingalpa - The Friends of Tingalpa Cemetery Heritage Group Inc held their fifth annual dinner on 24 August 2007 at the *Shangri La* Gardens Reception Lounge at Wynnum West. Sixty-five people attended. The group is well supported by the local elected representatives in local state and federal government. The evening was chaired by the local State member, Mr Chris Bombolas MP, Member for Chatsworth. Every person introduced themself at the beginning of the dinner.

Research report

It has been a very quiet month and for the first time in years there was a week when no enquires for material in our collection were received. Other enquiries for the month were for small searches where we found snippets of material on all of the following: Wenley House, Market Street, Brisbane; Eastern Rugby Club (Langlands Park), Thomas William Davis; a photo of Yungaburra Post Office and the 1954 Royal Tour.

During the month, however, Dr Kay Cohen researched and supplied information to the Conrad Hotel on the uses of rooms in the history of the former Land Administration/Executive Building.

Lyndsay Smith has started digitising the photographs in the hundred or so Photo Albums held by the Society. He has also photographed some of the books to be conserved in the **Adopt a Book** program

which has proved to be very popular among the Society's members and we appreciate and give thanks to all those who have so far made a contribution. Beth Johnson has been working on compiling an Index to the Society's *Bulletins* while Jean Stewart and Ian Hadwen have been preparing books for the next Book Auction to be held in 2008.

Items catalogued this month include information on the Queensland Institute of Medical Research (QIMR); Brisbane Kindergarten Teachers' College: Diamond jubilee souvenir: 60 years 1911-1971; Points north: Points of general interest between Cairns and Torres Strait; Amity: North Stradbroke Island; From Jimba to Dried Beef Creek: Leichhardt's travels in the Chinchilla district 1844-1848; Jandowae town and district history 1847-1988; Chinchilla centenary 1878 to 1978: Souvenir booklet; Port Douglas: A study of its historic buildings and townscape; Lady Gowrie Child Centre: A record of some of the events spanning those years 1940-1990: 'Year by year across five decades'; Centenary souvenir booklet of Brisbane Central State School 1874-1975; A century of Methodism: The Gap Methodist Church 1872-1972; Charleville centenary celebrations, November 1947: Souvenir booklet; St James Anglican Church Pratten: Centenary booklet 1881-1981; A short history of Miriam Vale Shire: The birthplace of Queensland: From the journals of Arthur Jeffery; Seven days to remember; The first Labor Government in the world: Queensland 1-7 December 1899; Frontier town: Charleville 1865-1901; Synchronome Brisbane 1903 – 1991: The story of the Jackson family of electrical clock makers; Wilston State School diamond jubilee: 1920-1980; Samford State 125^{th} School anniversary: 1872-1997; Tabernacle Baptist Church Brisbane Queensland centenary: 125th church anniversary and centenary of the opening of the Tabernacle.

Other donated items include the Brisbane telephone directory of 1940 and the Queensland Railway timetable for 1931. Peter Henderson donated the presidential address by JB Henderson to the Royal Society of Queensland in 1931 and G Henderson's reminiscences on railway construction (Queensland from 1885). Pam Turner donated her book *Following a dream*.

The Society recently received a review copy of a very interesting book, *The third metropolis*:

Imagining Brisbane through art and literature 1940-1970. A review of this book will be published in the next Bulletin. A 2005 documentary video by Channel 9 entitled *The Queensland way* has been added to the collection.






