## THE QUEENSLAND POLICE SERVICE CELEBRATES 150 YEARS OF POLICING

On 1 January 1864 the Queensland Force, comprising approximately 143 employees first began operating under its own legislation. The Force was divided into Metropolitan Police, Rural Police, Water Police and Native Police. Conditions were arduous and police often worked a seven day week, although they were entitled to every second Sunday free. A Police Officer worked a minimum nine hour day and often more when the situation required it. Leave was infrequent. The first Commissioner was D T Seymour who commanded the Force for 30 years.

This month we are fortunate to host a special lecture by Dr John Moses on Canon David Garland: From Cloth to Khaki and Back at the Commissariat Store on Wednesday 23 April from 5.00 pm to 6.30 pm. On Saturday 26 April, the RHSQ will host our first 'At Home' for 2014 titled *Rumours: Stories from the Great War*. The day will feature historic talks and the launch of our new World War I exhibition, *Call to Duty*, curated by Timothy Roberts in the morning. The afternoon session is intended to be a 'Show and Tell' session, with participants showcasing treasured artefacts from the First World War in an *Antiques Roadshow*-style set-up. I would like to thank the Isis and District Historical Society, the Rockhampton and District Historical Society and Dr Lorna McDonald for their generous hospitality of RHSQ Councillor Che Aberdeen and me during our tour through those regions on the weekend of 28 February to 3 March. Childers and Rockhampton have wonderful museums and their Societies do excellent work in preserving and recording the history of their region – I highly recommend a visit if you are in the area, and have included the contact details for each society and museum for your convenience:

Finally, it was with great sadness that we heard of the passing of historian Professor Kett Kennedy in Charters Towers last month. Professor Kennedy dedicated his career to documenting Queensland's mining industry and politics, focusing on North Queensland. At the time of his death he was helping to plan the International and Australasian Mining History Congress to be held in Charters Towers in July 2014. He will be greatly missed.

Interesting events which occurred in April 1914 (taken from Pugh's Almanac 1915):  $2^{nd} - A$  destructive hurricane swept over parts of the Darling Downs. Cambooya and Helidon were the hardest hit, with Cambooya suffering damage to the extent of £4000 and Helidon between £5000 and 6000;  $10^{th} - The$  Australian Bowling Carnival commenced in Brisbane;  $19^{th} - Coadjutor$  Archbishop Duhig laid the foundation stone of a new Presbytery at Stone's Corner, and blessed and opened a new Presbytery at Wooloowin.

#### Queensland News for March News From Around the State

**Balonne Shire** – The St George RSL is compiling a book listing all the soldiers and nurses from the current Balonne Shire area who served in World War I. Ms Karen Berry, an ex Navy official and member of St George RSL, has downloaded 5,000 scanned documents from the National Archives of Australia website (<u>www.naa.gov.au</u>) to commence the project. Two pages are envisaged for each person. Descendants of soldiers and nurses are invited to contact the St George RSL. At the 2013 Christmas function one descendent informed the meeting of an additional two Nolans who enlisted. (*Balonne Beacon* 27 February 2014 p.4)

**Eumundi** – The Eumundi Heritage and Visitor Centre has produced digital stories about Eumundi with photographs which will be an addition to the self guided leaflet on the town. A Regional Arts Development Fund grant enabled Discover Eumundi to collaborate with radio producer, Hamish Sewell, to interview local people and record their stories. Dick Caplick and Joe Whiting are featured. Eight locations in Eumundi with QR code will be able to be scanned by smart phone. (*Noosa News* 7 March 2014 p.24 including photograph of Eumundi CWA Hall.)

**Gympie** - Two million dollars may not be sufficient to fully refurbish the Mary Valley railway and repair the locomotive for the Mary Valley Rattler (MVHR). This was discussed at a recent meeting of the MVHR members and Gympie Regional Council Mayor, Cr Ron Dyne. The two groups are working together to resolve the issues. (*Gympie Times* 28 February 2014 pp.5,18)

**Richmond** – The area where the Kronosaurus Korner museum stands would have been under 40 metres of water in an inland sea 125 million years ago. The museum was designed to display local fossils from the Cretaceous Inland Sea that covered a large area of inland Queensland. A very recent discovery of a fish, *Cooyoo australis*, on a property 6 km east of Richmond has been recorded in *Alcheringa: a Australian Journal of Paleontology*. The find with several indentations illustrates predator-prey interaction between vertebrates. The museum is a popular heritage tourism attraction. (*Northern Miner* {Charters Towers} 18 February 2014 p.6 including photograph)

**St George** – The Heritage Centre is open again Monday to Friday 9 - 11 am. It had been severely damaged by the floods of January 2011 and was closed until means were found to refurbish it. Historical documents in the centre were removed before the flood reached the two buildings. (Personal visit 1 March 2014)

Toowoomba - Sir Anthony ('Tony') Robinson of television 'Time Team' fame will be visiting the Darling Downs in May 2014 as part of Tony Robinson's series called 'Tony Robinson's Tour of Duty for the History Channel. The series will commemorate World War I. The forward reconnaissance group visited the Toowoomba railway station's World War II bomb shelter and the World War I Roll of Honour. Program producer, Matthew Thomason's uncle, Stanley, appears on the Roll of Honour, and his father, Brian, worked in the railways at Toowoomba. Sir Anthony Robinson, Matthew Thomason and Greg Hallam, Queensland Railways historian, appear in a photograph of the Toowoomba railway station Honour Board, published in the Toowoomba Chronicle of 28 February 2014 pp.10-11.

**Warwick** – Restoration of the sewing room and nursery in the Historical Society's *Pringle Cottage* are now complete. The floors were also sanded and oiled. These activities were done under a grant from the Southern Downs Regional Council. Volunteers led by John Eastwell are now working on the threshing machine. (Warwick *Daily News* 17 January 2014 p.5 including photograph)

#### **Obituary**

# Kett Howard Kennedy, 1948-2014, historian, writer and academic

Kett Kennedy, a friend of 38 years and former Professor of History, Head of the Department of History and Politics, and JCU staff member from 1975 to 1997, died at home in Charters Towers, from cancer, on Saturday 22 February 2014.

Kett was a significant supporter of The Royal Historical Society of Queensland from 1977 onwards. He was a mentor, an enthusiast and encourager of historians and the study of history in the community as well as the University. He assisted the Society to obtain very high standard speakers and wrote the paper, 'A journey through Queensland's Northern Triangle Mount Morgan, Chillagoe, Mount Isa' presented as the Clem Lack Oration by Sir James Foots, Chairman of MIM Holdings Ltd on 22 March 1979 (Volume X No. 4 1978-1979 pages 29-46). Kett travelled down to Childers for the Society's regional conference in August 1995 and gave the after dinner speech at the Bowls Club on the use of oral history in historical research and its pitfalls, especially when that oral history is published. He referred to several early histories focusing on north Queensland and quoted from them and contrasted them with primary sources on the same subject. Kett presented the Clem Lack Memorial Oration on 28 March 1985 on 'Mount Isa's Russian Connection' focusing on the career of Leslie Urquhart (promoter of Mount Isa mine's development), the early years of Mount Isa and Urquhart's Russian connection (Volume XII No. 2, September 1985, pp.183-199).

His final paper to the Society was a joint one with Doug Hunt of James Cook University Cairns Campus, 'Bye bye blackbirder: The death of Ross Lewis' (Volume 19 No. 5, February 2006, p. 823).

Kett succeeded in persuading the Queensland Electoral Commission to change the proposed name for the electorate covering the area from Moranbah, including Charters Towers and up to Atherton from Macrossan to Dalrymple at the last redistribution. His submission describing the characters and careers of John M Macrossan and George E Dalrymple was presented to a lunch-time meeting of the Society by Ruth Kerr on Kett's behalf. The submission was included on the Commission's website.

Another of Kett's significant contributions to the Society was in encouraging history students and graduates of James Cook University to present papers to the Society for publication. He was also a great supporter of the Family History Society in Charters Towers, stimulating them to research cemeteries in their region, eg Sellheim.
