



Proposed Amendment to Constitution for Annual General Meeting on 29 September 2016

The Society's Council proposes the following amendment to the constitution of The Royal Historical Society of Queensland at the Annual General Meeting, on Thursday 29 September 2016:

Clause 15 (a) second line amend 'three months' to 'five months'

Reason: This will allow the Annual General Meeting to be held within five months of the end of the financial year, which will be by the end of November rather than the end of September. The extension is required to allow our auditors extra time to audit the financial accounts each year, which they do at no cost, as the short time period is proving difficult for the auditors to meet.

Queensland News

Amiens - In Anzac Day commemorations this year the battles on the Northern Front in France were highlighted. A feature article in the *Border Post* described the farms the soldiers left and the battles they fought in. The Railway Department decided to name all the stations on the Amiens railway after Northern Front battles – Fleurbaix, Pozieres, Bullecourt, Passchendaele, Bapaume, Messines and Amiens. The line was opened on 7 June 1920. Many returning soldiers lived near these small settlements which reminded them of the sites in northern France and Belgium where such great sacrifice had occurred. The railway station name boards are now preserved at Stanthorpe Heritage Museum. RHSQ Society members, Lorene Long and Murray Johnson, have done extensive research on the Soldier Settlements of the area. Atherton Railway Station Building is now located at Wondecla on the Wild River. It has been converted into historical guest facilities with two bedroom self contained accommodation. It is currently for sale, along with a house and shed on 4.96 ha. (*Tablelander* 3 May 2016 p.28 including photograph)

Ballandean - The Southern Downs Steam Railway ran a trip to Wallangarra on Saturday 16 April to coincide with celebrations of the Ballandean Hall Centenary. For the original opening the official party travelled by train from Stanthorpe. On the centenary the mayor of Southern Downs Regional Council, Tracey Dobie and husband Colin, and Member for Southern Downs, Lawrence Springborg MLA, and Gillian (granddaughter of the gentleman who performed the original opening) boarded the train at Stanthorpe, and alighted at Ballandean being greeted by an enthusiastic crowd, many in period costume. The train continued on to Wallangarra. (Southern Downs Steam Railway *Newsletter* May 2016 p. 2)

Caboolture – A memorial plaque has been rededicated at Caboolture railway station in honour of 74 men who boarded a train as part of the 25th Brigade, 7th Division to join the defence of Papua New Guinea from 1 September 1942. Six of these men, members of 31st Battalion Association and members of the Light Horse Group were in attendance. The function in mid May followed renovations at Caboolture station in 2015. (Queensland Rail *Weekly Notice* Edition 20, 23 May 2016)

Clifton – King's Creek timber bridge is being overhauled. It is more than 100 years old. King's Creek station opened in 1878. The goods shed, crane and loading stage were established in 1884 but there was a ground level platform. In 1900, the nearby Headington Hill property was being opened. King's Creek was increasing in importance. Kings Creek closed as a gate in 1931, the crane was removed in 1937 and the goods shed in 1941, while the cart weighbridge was put out of use and removed in 1950. Watering facilities including a water softening plant remained throughout the steam era. The station was closed in 1984. The Progress Association has applied to obtain bridge timbers. The Association is inviting members of the public to make submissions on what to do with the timber to commemorate the history of the bridge. Suggestions have been: making chunky seats in the railway precinct, making a sculpture with a plaque on it or to use the timber as poles for an entrance signage into the town. The timbers are to be donated to the Progress Association when the work is completed in June 2016. (Clifton Courier 25 May 2016 p. 6)

Mount Garnet, Wairuna Homestead – An application has been received by the Queensland

Heritage Council for the removal of the outbuildings from the heritage listing. (*Tablelander* 24 May 2016 p. 29; http://www.qldheritage.org.au/602823-wairuna-homestead.html)

Stanthorpe – A photograph of P Connell's *Miners Refuge* hotel at Broadwater Hotel near Stanthorpe was featured on page 2 in the *Border Post* newspaper of 21 April 2016. The photograph was part of the William Boag Collection of photographs.

Yungaburra – Local people are researching the Yungaburra Rifle Club and World War I soldiers from the area. RHSQ member, Ros Lauder from Yungaburra, was involved in honouring the rifle club men who enlisted and served at Gallipoli with knitted poppies. Knitted poppies were also made into a wreath and sent to Yungaburra to be laid at the War Memorial on Anzac Day 2016. (*Tablelander* 17 May 2016 p. 7 including photograph)

Research Report

The research team continues to be busy with queries for material relating to Aboriginal displacement in the Bundaberg region, on references to Dr Stephen Simpson, research relating to Allan Cunningham's 1827 trail in the Darling Downs, on identification of city buildings and streets for a song, on Robert Kerr Parker, on the Brisbane Line and on research for a WWI exhibition at the Commissariat Museum and on some sporting trophies held in the Museum.

Visitors to the library have been researching Serviceton and Inala, Moreton Island relating to William Lacy, Arthur Time, a successful search for images and material for Seqwater for celebrations relating to Hinze, Enoggera and Lake Manchester Dams; research for biographical material and images relating to the people involved in the establishment of the Sherwood Arboretum in the 1920s, especially of the people involved in planting trees in an avenue in 1925.

- must not have been presented as part of any family or local history society program during 2016 or before the conference in May 2017.

Two presentations, one on family history and one on local history, may be scheduled concurrently, and conference participants may choose to attend either presentation. Audio visual equipment will be available and there will be access to wireless broadband internet in the conference rooms.

THE FIRST PATROL CARS FOR THE QUEENSLAND POLICE

Your Speaker for July

Topic - The Question of Allegiances: Irish in the Queensland Police, 1911-1919. Speaker - Dr Anastasia Dukova

As the Home Rule Bill was halted due to WW1, the Irish Volunteers waged a nationwide anticonscription campaign: to fight for the Crown was to fight against the Irish cause.

Between 1911 and 1919, 72 Irishmen were sworn in into the Queensland Police Force. Subsequently, five enlisted into the AIF and two more returned to Britain to serve with the Irish Guards. Who were these men who migrated to Queensland amidst Ireland's final fight for her independence? Did any of them go back to Ireland as the War of Independence broke out following the execution of the Proclamation Signatories? What were the Queensland Irish attitudes to the Home Rule Bill, the Easter Rising, execution of the 1916 Martyrs, and Conscription?

Dr Anastasia Dukova is an Adjunct Research Fellow at the Griffith University Centre for Cultural Research. She is a policing historian specialising in the history of municipal policing, with a primary focus on Ireland, colonial Australia and Canada.


